Chief Magistrate Jennifer Lewis completed her undergraduate degree at the University of Georgia (UGA) in 1998, majoring in both Criminal Justice and Sociology. While at the University of Georgia, Lewis completed an internship with the Athens-Clarke County Solicitor General's Office. This is where she decided that she wanted to work in the court system. In 1998, after graduating from UGA, she began working for the Camden County court system. It was then that she was hired to serve as a part-time file clerk in the Magistrate Court.



Judge Lewis worked her way through the various positions within the Magistrate Court office and began attending Florida Coastal School of Law in 2002. She attended classes in the part-time evening program while serving as the Clerk of the Magistrate Court. In 2005, Lewis earned her Juris Doctorate from Florida Coastal School of Law. Judge Lewis served Camden County from 2005-2008 as an appointed full-time Magistrate Judge and was first elected and took office as the Chief Magistrate of Camden County on January 1, 2009.
