



Camden County Probate Court Judge Robert C. Sweatt, Jr.

Judge Robert C. Sweatt, Jr. took office as Probate Court Judge on May 1, 2013. As Probate Court Judge, he also serves as the Elections Superintendent for Camden County.



The office of the Probate Court is responsible for overseeing Vital Records (Death certificates and Birth certificates), Weapons Carry Permits, Marriage Licenses, Hearings on traffic offenses issued by the Camden County Sheriff's Office, Georgia State Patrol and the Georgia Department of Natural Resources, and Hearings on Probate and Guardianship Matters. Judge Sweatt's term will expire December 31, 2016.

Sweatt graduated from Camden County High in 1988 and went on to receive his B.S. in Business Administration from the University of Georgia in 1992. From there, he continued his education at Mississippi College School of Law, where he received a Juris Doctorate in 1995. Before being elected as Probate Court Judge, Sweatt was self-employed for over 18 years as an attorney in Kingsland.

He has been married to Ardith McCollough Sweatt, a Media Specialist at Mary Lee Clark, since 1995. They have two children, Carleton Sweatt, III, a high school senior and Breann Sweatt, a high school sophomore, both at Camden County High School.
