



Community Rating System and Erosion & Sedimentation Coordinator, Scott Brazell

Scott is a lifelong resident of Camden County, being raised on the family farm. He came to work for Camden County in 2006 as the Road Superintendent and as the Department was expanded in 2008, Scott was appointed the Director of Public Works. He served in that capacity until 2014 when he became the Community Rating System (CRS), Erosion & Sedimentation (E & S) Coordinator.



As CRS, E & S Coordinator, Scott is responsible for Flood Plain Management and Federal Emergency Management Association (FEMA) National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) compliance for Camden. He also is the administrator of our Land Disturbance Program in compliance with the Environmental Protection Division (EPD) ordinances relating to National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits. In addition, Scott is also responsible for administering Camden's Capital Road Projects, such as the Horse Stamp Church Road Interchange and the Kingsland By-Pass.

Prior to Scott being employed with Camden County, he worked as a Supervisor of Roads, Beaches, and Trails for the Jekyll Island Authority. Before that, he was employed with Gilman Paper Company in St. Marys.

Scott maintains certifications in several areas for Camden County that include:

- Certified Floodplain Manager (CFM)
- Georgia Soil & Water Conservation Level 1a, 1b, and 2 review
- Georgia Department of Transportation, LAP, PDP, ROW and Title VI
