


The Camden County PSA maintains twenty-five recreational facilities in the county. Our facilities offer something for the whole family. We hope you will take the time to get out and take a look at what we have to offer.

Most parks have areas that can be re-served for your convenience. Parks with kitchens do have a small fee that comes with reservation. Skate parks require a signed waiver on file and a permit before you may use the facilities.

All of our parks are closed between sunset and sunrise. Some areas are also seasonal.

Parks & Facilities



Camden Community Recreation Complex

The facility at 1050 Wildcat Drive in Kingsland is the hub of our organization. Our office staff is housed here, as well as a state of the art, fully equipped weight room; aerobics room; basketball gym; gymnastics gym; and two racquetball courts. Out back, we have our heated community pool and Phase 2—a baseball complex. Behind that is our model airplane runway. Next door, we have Chris Gilman Stadium—home to the Camden County Wildcats. Out front, there is a ¼ mile track.

Howard Peoples Park

This park is located on Gross Road in Kingsland and covers 18 acres. The list of amenities include 3 pavilions with picnic tables, 2 basketball courts, 4 lighted tennis courts, 2 softball fields, 2 playgrounds—one of which is handicap accessible, and restroom facilities.

Kingsland Lions Park

Located on South Grove Boulevard in Kingsland, this 12.4 acre park offers 3 pavilions, 4 baseball fields, 3 t-ball fields, 2 lighted tennis courts, 1 basketball court, a playground, and 4 separate restroom facilities. This is also the home to Justin's Miracle Field, a baseball field for the disabled.

Little Catfish Creek

This park covers 4.1 acres off of Highway 17, south of Kingsland city limits. This park offers travelers and residents alike a roadside picnic spot. Amenities include picnic tables, swings and a playground.

Browntown Wilderness Park

This 21.7 acre park is located west of the Kingsland city limits on Temple Creek Road. At this park, there is a basketball court, a multi-use field, a playground, a pavilion, and restroom facilities.

Temple Landing Boat Ramp

This facility is located at the end of Temple Creek Road, right down from the Wilderness Park. This park covers 3.3 acres and has a public boat ramp that accesses the St. Marys River, a floating fishing dock, and restrooms.

South HWY 17 Boat Ramp

Located on the Georgia/Florida line, this boat ramp offers access to the St. Marys River.

St. Marys Rec Authority Park/St. Marys Pool

Located off of Meeting Street in St. Marys, this 24 acre park has lots to offer. There are three baseball fields, a football field, a playground, 2 pavilions, and restrooms; along with a brand new skate park. There is also a public pool that has a slide, diving board, kiddie pool, restrooms, and shower area. The pool is open Memorial Day weekend thru Labor Day weekend.

St. Marys Civic Park

This 32 acre park is located on Herb Bauer Drive in St. Marys. Amenities include a pavilion, a baseball field, a softball field, 4 t-ball fields, 2 basketball courts, 2 tennis courts, a playground, and restrooms.

St. Marys Aquatic Center

Located in the St. Marys Civic Park on Herb Bauer Drive, this water park includes a splash mountain/kiddie pool, lazy river, and water slide. Open seasonally.

Camden County PSA Soccer Complex

This property has 8 soccer fields, a Club House, a fishing pond, restrooms and covers 14 acres. This facility is located off of Kings Bay Road in St. Marys.

Sweetwater Park

Located on Point Peter Road in St. Marys, this 7 acre park has 4 tennis courts, a multi-use field, 2 basketball courts, playground equipment with swings, and restrooms.

McIntosh Sugar Mill Park

This park is a historic landmark on 36 acres of land located off of Highway Spur 40 in St. Marys. Picnic tables are available at this park.

Point Peter Pond

This 9 acre piece of property has a stocked fishing pond for the public's enjoyment. It is located off of North River Causeway in St. Marys.

Woodbine Lions Park

This 5.2 acre park on Georgia Avenue in Woodbine has a big multi purpose field.

White Oak Nature Trail

This 3.5 mile bicycle and walking trail is located in White Oak. You can access the trail off of Highway 17, at the beginning of Highway 252 or farther south near Refuge Road.

Harriett's Bluff Boat Ramp
This public boat ramp sits on ¾ of an acre and offers access to Crooked River and a floating fishing dock. This facility is at the end of Harriett's Bluff Rd.

Harriett's Bluff Community Park
Located off of Harriett's Bluff Road (195, exit 7), this 21 acre park has something for everyone. It offers an octagon-shaped screened in pavilion with full kitchen facilities, restrooms, picnic tables scattered throughout the park, a basketball court, a tennis court, and a nature trail.

Cornelia Jackson Memorial Park

This is a seven acre park located on 15th Street in Woodbine. This park offers a pavilion with a full kitchen, a lighted basketball court, a football field, a playground, picnic tables, and restrooms.

Woodbine 110 Community Park

Situated on 8.4 acres off of Highway 110 in Woodbine, this park offers a baseball field, a football field, a lighted tennis court, a basketball court, a playground, and restrooms.

Woodbine Nature Trail

This feature was once an old rail way and has now been converted into a walking trail. Beginning on HWY 110, this trail extends south to 11th street and north to the Satilla river, where a walkway extends over the marshlands and then connects to a boardwalk along the river that ends at the Satilla Waterfront Park. There are benches situated along the way for those who want to rest and enjoy the scenery.

Satilla Waterfront Park

This park sits right off of Hwy 17 N on 3.2 acres of waterfront property on the Satilla River in Woodbine. It offers two pavilions, a public boat ramp, floating fishing dock, and restrooms. There is also a small stage. This park is home to the annual Woodbine Crawfish Festival.

Mary B. Smart Park

This park is located on New Post Road in Woodbine. It sits on 17 acres and offers a baseball field, a basketball court, a tennis court, playground equipment, and restrooms.

Maple Ford Park

This 40 acre park is located on Spring Bluff Road in Waverly. This park has a screened in pavilion, a baseball field, a basketball court, a volleyball court, playground equipment, and restrooms.

White Oak Boat Ramp

This public boat ramp sits on 1 ½ acres off of Highway 17 North in White Oak and offers a dock and boat ramp that accesses the Satilla River.

Spring Bluff Boat Ramp

Located near the Camden-Glynn County line off of HWY 17, this park has a boat ramp and floating dock and offers access to the Little Satilla River.
